Various items comprise this week’s column. First off, as a follow-up to the Parish Town Hall Meetings people have asked about how to further contribute to the “**Blue Envelope**” Assessment once they’ve sent in their “blue” envelope. Some people are making installment contributions to the assessment appeal, others are making additional donations, and still others for whatever reason simply don’t have the blue envelope or card. Any contribution to the assessment appeal should be clearly marked on a separate envelope (of any color) and on the check:

“**Assessment.**” Contributions to this appeal are kept entirely separate from the parish general funds so that they are not included in future assessments. In other words, we don’t want to pay a further “church tax” on these donations since they are going to pay our outstanding “church tax” or assessment. Thank you for your generosity in helping to pay down this past due account. We are below the \$200,000 mark. Can we pay it off by the time Fr. Mike returns?

A message in another part of this bulletin alerts drivers not to use our **cemetery** driveway as a thoroughfare. You may have noticed recent construction around the large **crucifixion tableau** located in the center of the cemetery. This impressive statue is 85 years old. Its stone base was crumbling, which could eventually endanger the entire statue. We are grateful for a very generous donation from Stan and Cindy Jaskolski which was directed to the repair of the huge stone base of this statue as well as the addition of lights to this important Biblical scene. This is another way of preserving our sacred history as well as showing respect for this holy site which holds and honors those who have gone before us in faith.

November 2, All Souls Day, is on a Sunday. The weekend Masses will honor in a special way all those who were buried from St. James this past year. This is a fine time to take a walk through our parish cemetery, read the tombstones, and pray for our deceased relatives and friends.

An easy way to take a walk through the cemetery would be to help with the cemetery and parish grounds fall clean-up on **Saturday, November 1st**. Since **All Saints Day** is on a Saturday it is not a holy day of obligation and therefore we will not have a morning Mass that day.

And as a way to warm the heart, heat up the tummy, and get some energy for the fall clean-up come and enjoy some of the tastiest chili and chicken soup this side of I-94 at the annual **SOS Chili Cook-Off on Monday, October 27th**, at the Sussex Armory. Get it while it’s hot!

St. Martin de Porres Emergency Plea

Two weeks ago we received an emergency plea from Fr. Dave at St. Martin's that their food pantry was entirely empty and that they would be forced to close until it could be restocked. Our Human Concerns Committee rearranged its weekly tithes so that one could be sent immediately to St. Martin's and our St. Vincent de Paul society responded with immediate cash assistance through its “Needy Conference” fund. Here is the response we received from Fr. Dave this past week:

Thanks much to the parish and to St. James' St. Vincent de Paul. We immediately went out and bought food to cover this week in the pantry. We will just get through because Hunger task Force came by to drop off fresh produce which added to what we purchased. We will get a shipment next week which will be quite large because of the volume that we distributed last month.

My bookkeeper here also works on the far south side and says that the pantry at St. Roman is experiencing the same thing. Evidently a lot of people have had their quest cards reduced and they are having trouble making it. Changes in programs quickly affect the population that is living on the edge. We will have to see if this is an initial re-adjustment or if this is something that pushes people into begging for food.

Thanks again for helping us to keep our doors open this week. Your help was much needed and appreciated. I will be talking to hunger Task Force next week about what they think is going to happen and how we should strategize long term.

A Note from the Parish Nurse, Pam Dennis:

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, which is an annual campaign to increase awareness of the disease. While most people are aware of breast cancer, many forget to take the steps to have a plan to detect the disease in its early stages and encourage others to do the same.



It is important to be proactive concerning your health care screenings, this is where it can be detected. Over the past years we have made progress but still have a long way to go and need everyone's help. According to the National Cancer Institute, when breast cancer is detected early, in the localized stage, the 5-year survival rate is 98%.

Why do you need an early detection plan? Statistics show that one in eight women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime. The National Breast Cancer Foundation promotes the best way to fight breast cancer is to have a plan in place to detect it in its early stages. They promote "Create Your Early Detection Plan" to receive reminders to do breast self-exams, and schedule your clinical breast exams and mammograms based on your age and health history. This is found on their website.

You can also find on their website a link called: What is Beyond the Shock? It is a free, comprehensive, online guide to understanding breast cancer. It is a resource for women who have been diagnosed with breast cancer, a place for loved ones to gain a better understanding of the disease, and a tool for doctors to share information. This website also offers a link for fundraising events. They offer information on how to start a ticketed event, personal fundraising page as well as upcoming fund raising events in your area to get involved in your community and help support the National Breast Cancer Foundation.

In recognition of breast cancer awareness month you can find pink ribbon pins in the gathering area to help support breast cancer prevention.

One suggestion was that we forget the "Field" part of the name altogether and just refer to them as gardens (not fields). Four - Relates to the earth – four seasons, four directions: North, South, East, West

Five – A number associated with grace – Jesus multiplied five loaves to feed 5,000

Six – The number of man – Adam and Eve were created on the sixth day

Seven – Refers to the number of God, divine perfection or completeness – "on the seventh day God rested" (Is that our stopping point?)

Faithful Citizenship – Life and Dignity of the Human Person

Why is protecting the unborn of such great importance?

As Pope Francis explains, "Among the vulnerable for whom the Church wishes to care with particular love and concern are unborn children, the most defenceless and innocent among us. Nowadays efforts are made to deny them their human dignity and to do with them whatever one pleases, taking their lives and passing laws preventing anyone from standing in the way of this. . . [T]his defence of unborn life is closely linked to the defence of each and every other human right. It involves the conviction that a human being is always sacred and inviolable, in any situation and at every stage of development. Human beings are ends in themselves and never a means of resolving other problems. Once this conviction disappears, so do solid and lasting foundations for the defence of human rights, which would always be subject to the passing whims of the powers that be." (Evangelium Gaudium, 213)

What about other human rights?

"The right to life implies and is linked to other human rights – to the basic goods that every human person needs to live and thrive. All the life issues are connected, for erosion of respect for the life of any individual or group in society necessarily diminishes respect for all life. The moral imperative to respond to the needs of our neighbors – basic needs such as food, shelter, health care, education, and meaningful work – is universally binding on our consciences and may be legitimately fulfilled by a variety of means. Catholics must seek the best ways to respond to these needs." (FCFC, 25)
