

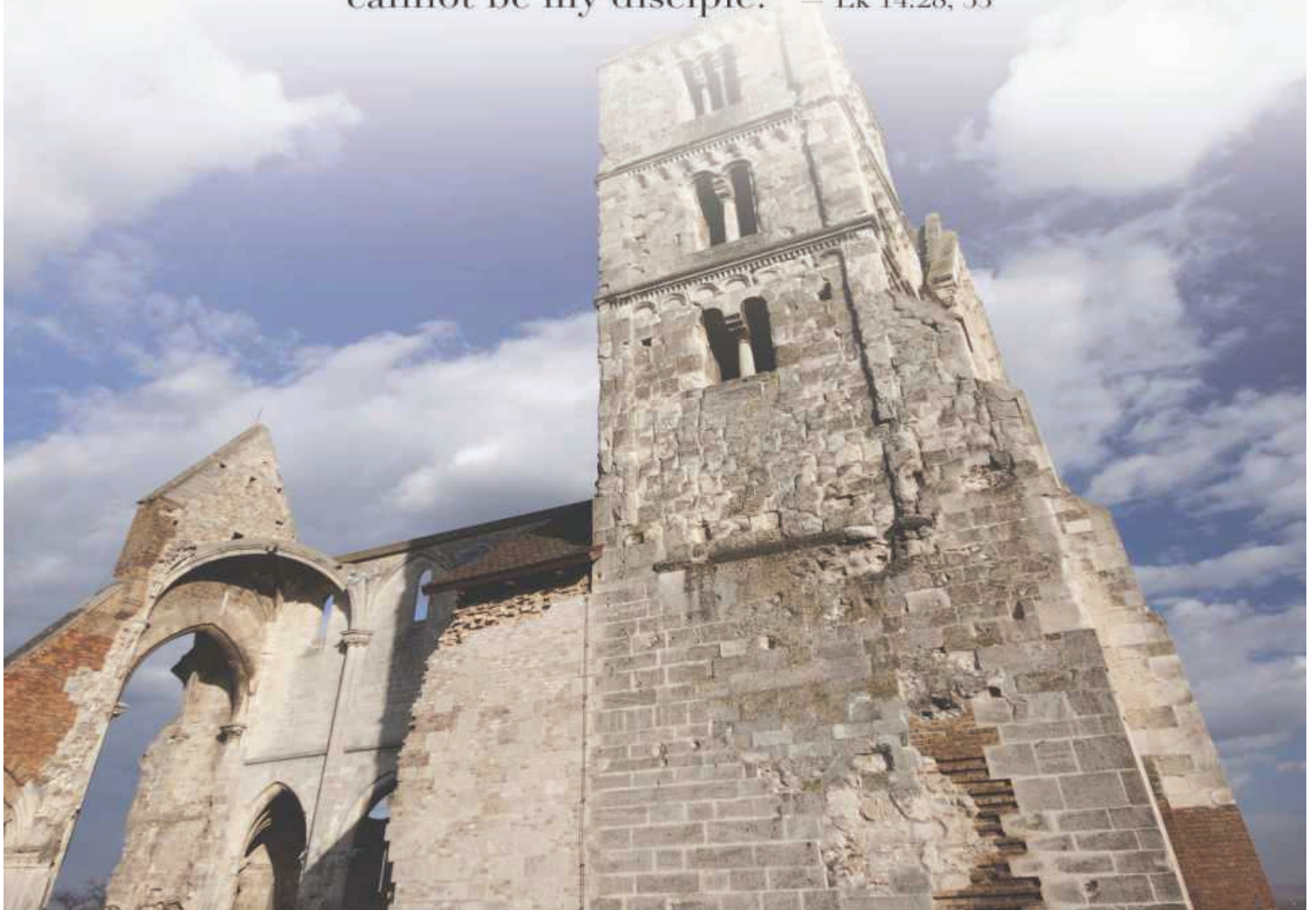

From The Servant's Quarters

- We couldn't ask for a more appropriate gospel to launch us into the fall season for growing in our faith. Jesus is quite direct in describing what it takes to be a "disciple," that is, a learner or student (apprentice?) of his way of life. It may strike us as harsh when he says we need to "turn our backs" on those closest to us. Jesus calls for a whole hearted commitment to him, his perspective, his attitudes and behaviors.
- The irony is that the more we do that, the better off are our closest loved ones. We will grow in loving them in a non-possessive, non-clinging way. We will attempt to not "smother" our loved ones. We will attempt to relate to them the way Jesus relates to us - with unconditional love, demanding nothing in return, but cherishing the unique response of love from each of us.
- Jesus presents a very countercultural way of loving and living. We can only grow in "His Way" if we take the posture of a disciple, a learner, and hang on to his every word. His living word is transformative. So I hope everyone is able to take advantage of the many opportunities we have this autumn to grow in faith. That could be with the GIFT program, the SOAL program, a special speaker, Bible Study, or participating in the discussion session in preparation for the Archdiocesan Synod next June.

Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens

Last Saturday (i.e. August 31st) we planted our final succession crop in the Field of Dreams garden. The rest of the raised beds will start to empty out over the course of the next month or two as we continue to harvest produce. Volunteers selected seeds that will germinate and come to harvest within 60 days which will bring us to the 1st of November. We will have to stay vigilant for frost from mid October on and maybe have to take precautionary steps like covering some of the beds when frost is predicted. It's sad to start forecasting the end of the season and colder weather, but that's where we're seasonally at.

Tomatoes and peppers are in full harvest due to the heat so we'll continue to see production from our Field of Hope garden. We've had our largest donations to the food pantry these past couple of weeks and will continue to donate our "heavier" produce of tomatoes and peppers for the next two to three weeks as fruit continues to ripen. We'll tally up our overall donations at the end of the season so we can compare donations to previous years. Each year is different with different challenges beyond our control, which continues to make our mission the challenge that it is for our volunteers.

We'll also be meeting to start the planning process for next year, along with our season's end dinner which is always a vegetarian delight with all the fresh fruits and vegetables provided by our volunteers in a pot luck buffet. A Note from the Parish Nurse, Pam Dennis:

I recently read in the Lake County newspaper about the importance of keeping up with your immunizations. I thought I would highlight in this week's bulletin the shingles vaccination. The shingles vaccination was recommended by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices in 2006 to reduce the risk of shingles and its associated pain in people age 60 years and older. The study showed that the vaccination greatly reduced disease in this age group. You may not know but the most recent statistics say that almost 1 out of 3 people in the United States will develop shingles. According to the Center for Disease control (CDC) there are an estimated 1 million cases each year in this country.

What exactly is shingles you may ask? Shingles is a painful localized skin rash often with blisters. It is caused by the varicella zoster virus, the same virus that causes chickenpox. Anyone who had chickenpox can develop shingles because the varicella zoster virus remains in the nerve cells of the body after the chickenpox infection clears. For reasons that are not fully known, the virus can reactivate years later, causing shingles. Children can even contract shingles but it is more commonly seen in men and women 50 years or older. People who have medical conditions that keep the immune systems from working properly, such as certain cancers, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and people who receive immunosuppressive drugs, such as steroids or drugs given for transplantation are also at greater risk of getting shingles. Several antiviral medicines such as acyclovir are available to treat shingles. The medicine helps shorten the length and severity of the illness. To be effective, they must be started right away.

Immunization with the shingles vaccination is the best way to practice preventative healthcare. Most insurances will cover the vaccination for adults 55 years old and older. Medicare part D also covers this vaccination. It is less expensive if you get it at a local pharmacy than at the doctor's office. Our local Shopko in Sussex can give you the vaccination. Per the pharmacy manager, it is best to call ahead for a good time to go and get it but it is given on a walk in basis. The estimated time to allow is 30 minutes for getting the vaccination.
