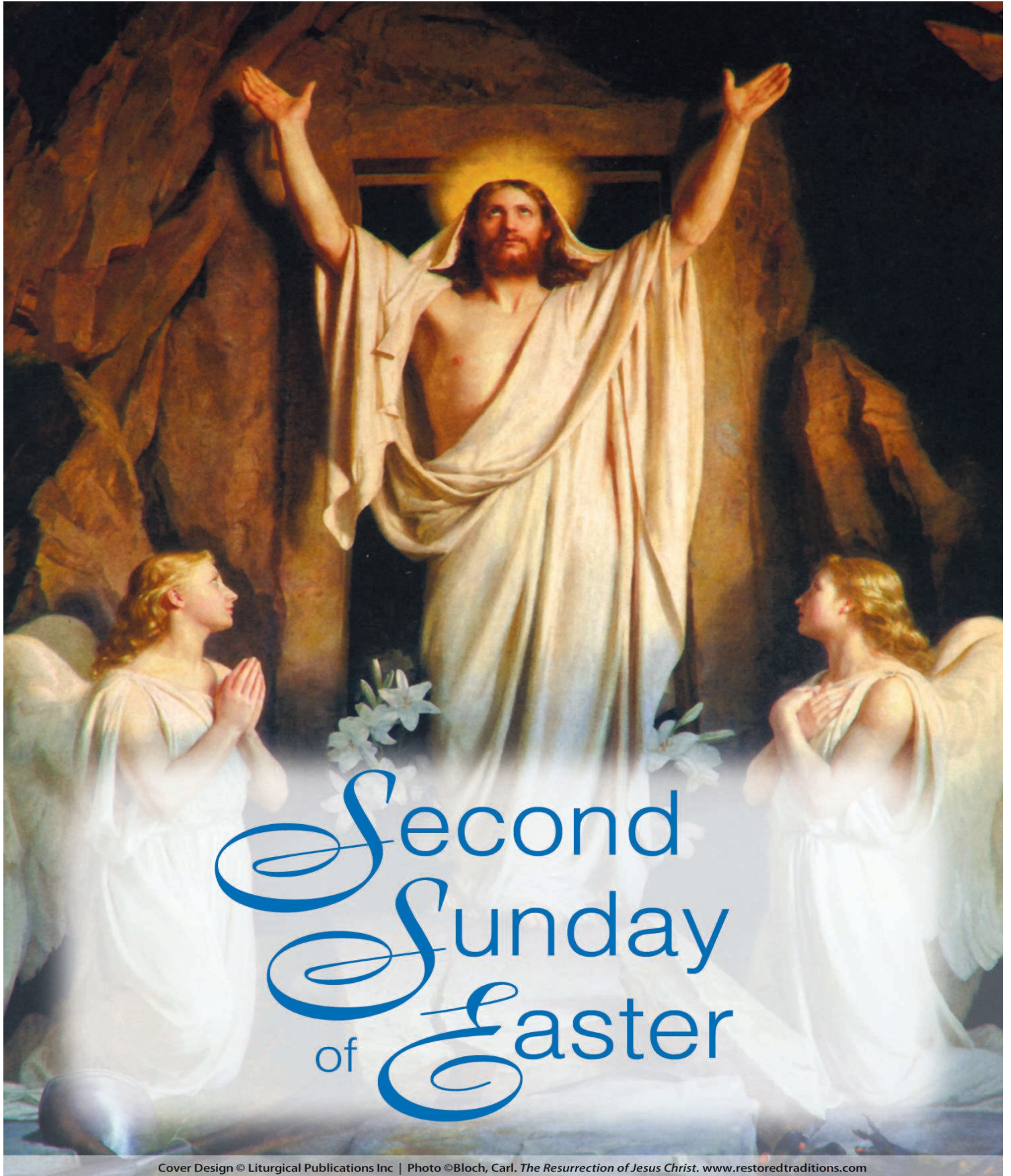

From The Servant's Quarters

- I feel very fortunate that my life during the grade school years was deeply influenced by the Racine Dominican Sisters. I thought of them today as I read the passage from Luke's Gospel given to us for the second Sunday of the Easter Season. When Thomas places his hands into the five wounds on the body of the Risen Lord, he utters in hushed tones, "My Lord and My God."



- I remember Sister teaching us to echo those words of Thomas when participating in the Mass. As the priest holds up the Consecrated Host we were to say in our hearts, "My Lord and My God." As the Consecrated Wine is elevated, we again echoed Thomas, "My Lord and My God."

- My hope and prayer for all of us this Easter Season is that we can carve out some quiet time to commune with the Risen Lord. Our New Evangelization Team under the leadership of Gerry Wolf has been distributing an Easter gift to all our parishioners. If you did not receive your copy of Re-discovering Jesus by Matthew Kelly, please help yourself to the remaining books in the gathering space. One suggestion would be to read a chapter a day. Place your hands into the wounds of the Risen Lord. Allow Him to breathe the same Spirit into you as He did into the Disciples in the Upper Room.

- "Shalom! Peace be with you." Receive the Holy Spirit." "Do not be unbelieving but believe."

- You may have heard we had some excitement in the school building Easter Monday evening. One wall heater in the entry way over heated. The entire building was filled with smoke. Fortunately, there was no fire damage, just smoke damage, thanks to the quick action of our local fire departments. A broken door needed to be repaired and the building needed professional cleaning to remove the smoke smell. Yes, we do have insurance, but this pointed out the need to update all 20 of the heating units so something worse doesn't happen. We are discovering they are badly in need of repair.

- And in the name of our entire faith community I thank all who helped to make our Holy Week and Easter celebrations so festive, inspiring and beautiful. When I first arrived here, one of our long time parishioners said to me, "Wait till you see how we do Easter!" We are most blessed with this evidence of the Spirit moving among us.

The Earth Recycles and So Should We

"Each year hundreds of millions of tons of waste are generated, much of it non-biodegradable, highly toxic and radioactive, from homes and businesses, from construction and demolition sites, from clinical, electronic and industrial sources. The earth, our home, is beginning to look more and more like an immense pile of filth." [Pope Francis, LS 21]



Recycling Electronics. State law bans electronics and appliances from landfills and incinerators due to the valuable materials that can be recycled and reused, including precious metals like gold and copper and hazardous materials such as lead, mercury, cadmium, chromium and chemical flame retardants that need to be disposed of properly. On **Saturday, April 19 from 9:00 a.m. to noon, a one-day collection of electronics and appliances will be held in Hartland at 701 Progress Drive.**

Items that will be collected for a cash only fee: television sets (\$20 each); Cathode Ray Tube computer monitors (\$5 each). **Items collected at no fee:** computers, other computer monitors, printers, keyboards, laptops, scanners, DVD players, VCRs, stereos, cell phones, telephones, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, refrigerators, microwaves, watercoolers, freezers, water heaters, washer/dryers, stoves, oven/ranges, dishwashers. **Want to recycle your CFL lightbulbs?** Place them in the basket next to the Lost and Found in the gathering space.

St. James Community Gardens

During a lull at a recent garden planning meeting, the conversation wandered off topic as conversations are likely to do among friends and various gardeners started talking dirt. Not juicy dirt, mind you, just plain old dirt. And those with the inside scoop really dished on dirt.



If you look at a clump of dirt you might not realize how complex it is. If plants are to grow well, they need just the right amount of nutrients. Too much nitrogen and tomatoes produce great leaves, but not much in the way of tomatoes. However leafy greens such as spinach do well with nitrogen. In addition to nutrients, soil is full of life. By some accounts there could be 13,000 species of microbes in a teaspoon of soil! These little critters make it possible for the plants to absorb the essential nutrients. Some of the microbes need oxygen and live near the surface; others don't like oxygen and live deeper down. The general consensus about garden dirt was to avoid disturbing it too much. Gentle lifting is fine, but gardeners are realizing that there is a structure to soil and just randomly digging down and turning it over may be doing more harm than good.

Next time you look at a clump of dirt, think about the life in there...thousands of microbes finding just the right spot to do their jobs so we can eat. Actually it can be a bit of an Easter reflection...new life from what seemed to be dead. Our volunteers are starting to plant the seedlings. They will be ready for the **annual plant sale coming up on the weekend of May 21/22**. Have you marked your calendars?
