PEW VIEW "THE CROSS OF IRON"

On April 16, 1953, the retired United States General, who had led the Allied troops to victory in Europe during World War II, and had recently taken office as President of the United States, delivered a speech questioning the excessive cost of providing military armaments to keep peace in the world. He said.

Every gun that is made, every warship launched, every rocket fired signifies, in the final sense, a theft from those who hunger and are not fed, those who are cold and are not clothed.

This world in arms is not spending money alone. It is spending the sweat of its laborers, the genius of its scientists, the hopes of its children.

The cost of one modern heavy bomber is this: a modern brick school in more than 30 cities. It is two electric power plants, each serving a town of 60,000 population. It is two fine, fully equipped hospitals.

It is some fifty miles of concrete pavement.

We pay for a single fighter plane with a half million bushels of wheat.

We pay for a single destroyer with new homes that could have housed more than 8,000 people.

This is, I repeat, the best way of life to be found on the road the world has been taking.

This is not a way of life at all, in any true sense. Under the cloud of threatening war, it is humanity hanging from a cross of iron. These plain and cruel truths define the peril and point the hope that come with this spring of 1953.

This is one of those times in the affairs of nations when the gravest choices must be made, if there is to be a turning toward a just and lasting peace.

It is a moment that calls upon the governments of the world to speak their intentions with simplicity and with honesty.

It calls upon them to answer the question that stirs the hearts of all sane men: is there no other way the world may live?

This is the week of "The Cross." President Dwight D. Eisenhower referred to humanity hanging on "the cross of iron" made from military armament. The cross was prominent during this Lent at St. James and upon it we hung some of the needs of our community. This coming Friday we will venerate THE cross "upon which hung our salvation." President Eisenhower asked, "...is there no other way the world may live" than to hang people on a cross? What have we learned in almost 2,000 years, even the past 58 years? Is there no other way to live?

There is! Come and experience the possibilities and the joy of new life this Easter especially by participating in the Easter Vigil Liturgy this coming Saturday.

Thank you for taking the needs of the poor off our wooden cross this Lent. Now may we only do the same with the cross of iron.
