

- ❖ What about us? Do we recognize that we are loved by God? Can we also recognize that we are anointed with a particular purpose that is granted to no one else? Isaiah, Mary and John have starring roles in the salvation of the world. While our roles may not be noted in the ages to follow, dare we believe that we are no less important?
- ❖ I am neither Isaiah nor Mary nor John the Baptist, but on most days I understand that I am a beloved child of God with a divine purpose. During this Advent season we can revive our own salvation history and emerge as an ambassador for Christ.
- ❖ Did you know that for many years our Archdiocese has had a sister parish in the Dominican Republic? We provide the priests for the parish of La Sagrada Familia (Holy Family Parish) as well as financial support. Today the ushers are giving you an attractive bookmark with interesting information about our sister parish. Becoming Advent People – Migration Week

On January 7-8, 2012, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of Our Lord will mark the beginning of the Church's observance of National Migration Week.

Catholic social teaching on immigration has biblical roots, both in the Old and New Testaments. Israel, the Chosen People, was oppressed into slavery in Egypt; with God's help, the Israelites escaped into the desert until God fulfilled for them the promise of a land they could call home. In addition to Mathew's gospel story of Joseph and Mary escaping to Egypt to protect their child, the New Testament also gives us the Apostle Paul who firmly establishes the equality of all people before God: "There is neither Jew nor Greek....for you are one in Christ Jesus" (Gal 3:28)

The third principle of Catholic social teaching on immigration states that "a country has the right to regulate its borders and to control immigration"; this is followed by a fourth principle, which is "a country must regulate its borders with justice and mercy". While people have a right to migrate, no country is required to accept all that want to enter. But a country cannot simply decide to take care of its own people and no one else. Immigration policies that are just and merciful will be concerned about all people and will take into account the rights of families to live together. An immigration policy that allows people to live in the U.S. as contributors to society but fails to offer an opportunity to achieve legal status does not serve the common good.

As natives or immigrants, we are comforted my Paul's letter today – there is a need to always rejoice, even in difficult times. We must seek to do what is right and just, despite the temptation to give in or give up in the face of life's struggles.
