

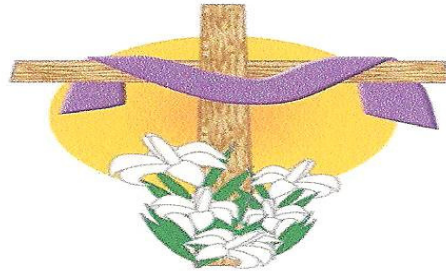

MISSION STATEMENT

St. James is a vibrant, welcoming Catholic Community Journeying towards the fullness of the Kingdom of God through worship, formation and service.

PEW VIEW**Who will be the next pastor?**

"Do we know who the next pastor will be?" is a commonly asked question around St. James. The answer is a definite "No" and here's why. The appointment of a pastor follows a very structured process and we are only about halfway through that process. The process and timeline are these:

1. With Archbishop Listecki's acceptance of Fr. Art's retirement in June of 2011 (priests can retire as early as 68 years of age and Fr. Art will turn 68 on June 12th) St. James parish became "open listed" for a new pastor.
2. The director of priest personnel queried all priests who were reaching retirement age as well as those whose terms were expiring to determine their intentions. (Pastors are usually assigned for a 6 year term, generally renewable once for a total of 12 years.) Once it was determined which parishes would need new pastors an "open list" was developed and sent to all priests in January.
3. During February the Director of Priest and Lay Ecclesial Placements holds a consultation with the staff and council from each parish that has a pastoral opening. The Director, Mr. Rick Tank, met with the St. James staff and council on Wednesday, February 9th. He explained the process for appointing a pastor, presented statistics on the shortage of priests, and engaged the group in a discussion on "What we are proud of about St. James; what some of our goals are; and what we hope for in the new pastor."
4. The staff and some leadership from the parish also completed a "parish profile," a written document which highlights some of the many attributes of St. James. (This becomes like an advertisement, which hopes to entice a priest to want to come to St. James.)
5. This past week Fr. Art, along with other pastors who are leaving their pastorates, met prospective pastors to share the profiles and further information about the available parishes. **[This is where we are in the process.]**
6. During March priests will make their top three selections to the Priest Placement Board. The Board will also conduct interviews with each applicant to discuss his specific talents and gifts for the available parishes.
7. By the end of March or in early April the Priest Placement Board will make its recommendations on appointments to Archbishop Listecki.
8. The Archbishop will reflect upon the recommendations and make the final determination of appointments.
9. By the first week of May (in time for the annual Priest Assembly) priests will be notified of their new appointments by the Archbishop.
10. Parishes will be notified of the appointments by mid-May.
11. Priests move to their new assignments typically on the third Tuesday of June.

What can we do? Keep praying that the Holy Spirit will guide the selection process.

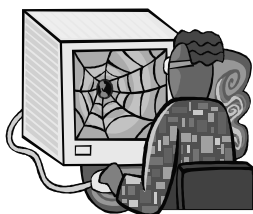

Field of Dreams Community Garden

Spring is coming! Can you believe that in about six weeks volunteers will begin digging in our garden and preparing the soil for planting? It can be hard after this past weekend's blizzard conditions, but our gardeners are getting exciting. Some of our volunteers have already met and laid out the crop rotation for this year. This process help replenish nutrients from last year. They have also been busy ordering and selecting seeds. Depending upon the germination time(s) of some of our cool weather crops, some seeds will be started indoors within a couple of weeks. If you are thinking of your own home garden, think about "Planting an Extra Row" for the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry, which is where our produce gets donated. Last year we had several parishioners bring extra vegetables from their home gardens to church to be combined with ours. Another parishioner has volunteered to provide recipes to go along with our produce, so CCOS food pantry clients have ideas as to how to prepare our vegetables. And our volunteers are planning another flower and plant sale. More details will be provided on the sale as we get closer to Spring.
