

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



It's a way of counting the weeks in between the major seasons of our faith celebrations.) This weekend is the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. We have another "epiphany," another manifestation of the power and the glory of God in our

party where Jesus parties?! This event would certainly make Jesus the lead off story on Entertainment Tonight! The gospel writer tells us that this is the first of "seven signs" Jesus performs.

- What is it that is made manifest with this first sign? The in-breaking of the era of the messiah into the human condition. Marriage celebrations are symbolic of the era that is to be ushered in by the messiah. The rich food and overflowing of choice wine points to God's abundance showered indiscriminately upon the people of God.
- What is to be our response? In the words of the Blessed Mother, "Do whatever he tells you." Trust in the word of Jesus. Accept the word of Jesus. In living this way there is an experience of the glory of the Lord. "With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption."
- Friday, January 18th, is the beginning of the annual week of prayer for Christian Unity. We are extremely blessed in our area to have fruitful relationships with our other Christian sisters and brothers. What an inspiration the CCOS is! Addressing the Need for Immigration Reform

Since 2005 the US Catholic Bishops through their Justice for Immigrants campaign have sought to unite Catholics in support of comprehensive immigration reform. Their position is rooted in Catholic social teaching which at its core seeks to uphold the human dignity of all people, to uphold family unity, and to care for the poor and the stranger in our midst – concerns for which our current series of immigration laws miss the mark. One need not look further than the life and words of Jesus Christ to understand that persons on the move—refugees, migrants, immigrants—are special in the eyes of God.

The US Bishops are asking that a new comprehensive law include the following:

A path to citizenship for undocumented persons in the country

Preservation of family unity as a corner-stone of our national immigration system

Legal paths for low-skilled immigrant workers to come and work in the United States

Restoration of due process protections to our immigration enforcement policies

Addresses the root causes (push factors) of migration, such as persecution and economic disparity

A Note From Pam Our Parish Nurse:

If you have not gotten your flu shot please consider going and getting one soon. There is a high incidence of influenza in the Midwest states with many hospitals closing their emergency rooms due to the amount of patients being seen with the flu. Take some time this week and go get your flu shot. It is a safe way to protect yourself from getting the flu and most health insurers cover this injection.

The Rest of the Story

Be honest, when someone says "I am pro-life", we immediately think they are against legalized abortion, and presume they are politically conservative. End of story. But as Paul Harvey used to say, "here is the rest of the story".

Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, the former archbishop of Chicago, was certainly pro-life. However, in contrast to the single abortion issue focused political slogan, Cardinal Bernardin was "pro-all-life". He was best known for his teaching about what he called "the seamless garment". Cardinal Bernardin reminded us that our church believes that all life, given all are created by God, has intrinsic value and dignity. Our belief is seamless as in continuous, whole, complete, undivided.

As Catholics, we believe that there is a seamless dignity of life connecting all life from conception to natural death. What Cardinal Bernardin refers to as the "seamless garment", the church refers to as the Consistent Life Ethic.

In practical application, what does this mean? It means we need to be more consistent and seamless with our laws and policies. It means that we should be concerned about protection of the child in the womb, as well as the child starving from hunger and malnutrition. It means we should be looking for ways to eradicate war, and wipe out euthanasia. It means we should oppose capital punishment, and reform our prison system providing opportunities to reform lives. The list is long. The need for human dignity is great.

Something else we believe in sisters and brothers is the power of prayer. We have an opportunity to spend some time before God, in the presence of the blessed sacrament, to pray for life – all life. For the fourth year, the deacons of the Archdiocese have organized a Holy Hour for Life. Our cluster of Good Shepherd, St. James and St. Mary's will hold one at St. Mary's Menomonee Falls **this coming Wednesday January 23, 2013 at 6:00PM**. Please consider joining us as we ask God to guide and inspire us in this important and holy work ... to assure dignity and respect for all life. Amen.


