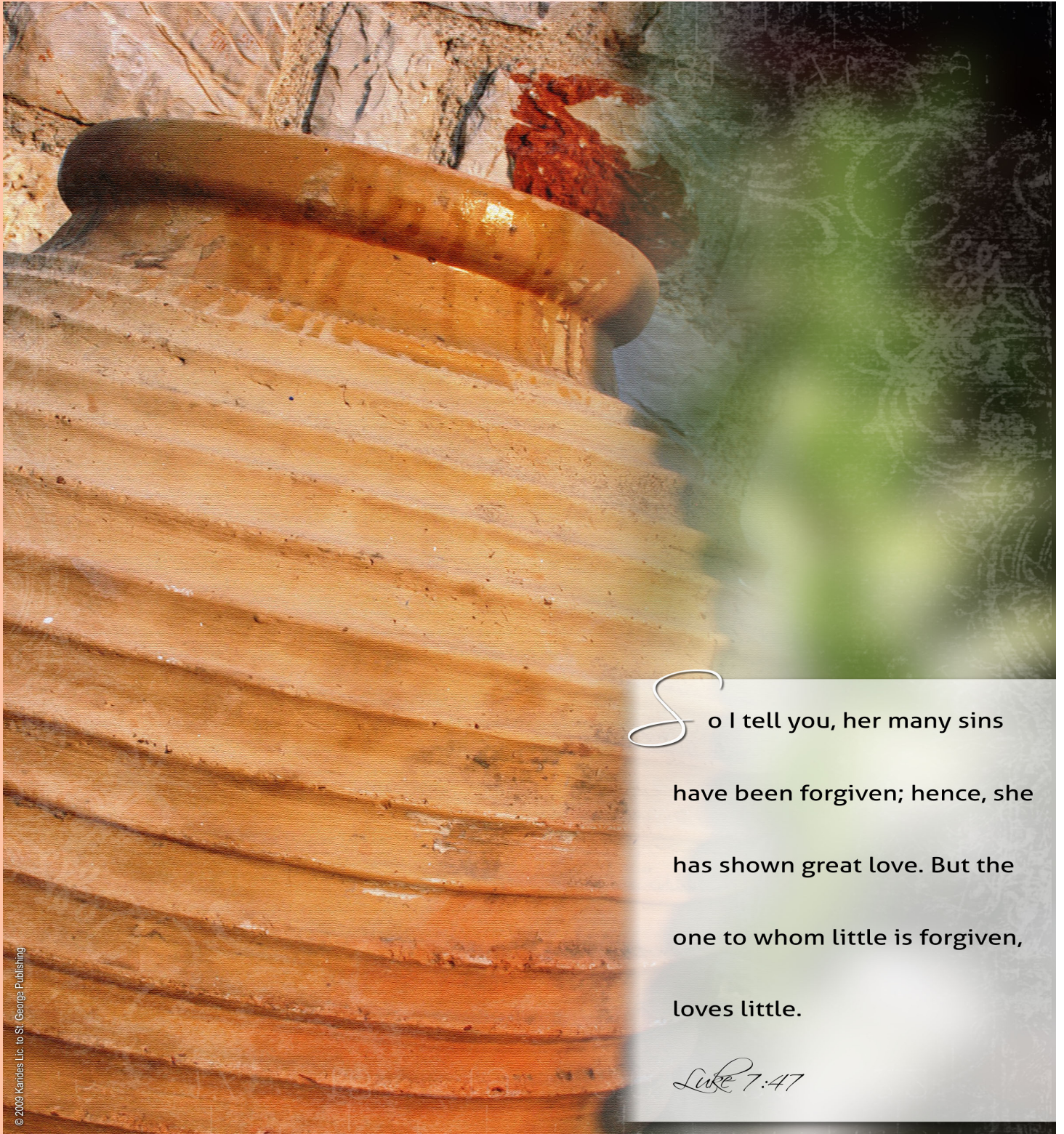

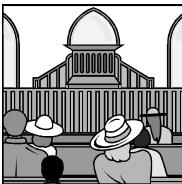

**PEW VIEW
Jesus and Women**

Today's Gospel ends with the naming of some of the women who were part of Jesus' itinerant preaching and ministry: "Mary, called Magdalene...Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, Susanna...and many others who provided for them out of their resources." (Lk. 8:3) The first three verses from chapter 8 are an interesting appendage to what precedes this Gospel, which is the story of the forgiven woman who anoints the feet of Jesus in the house of Simon the Pharisee. The proclamation could well have ended with Jesus' dismissal to the sinful woman with "Go in peace." Why do we have this additional passage?

The footnote for Chapter 8:1-3 in the New American Bible describes how radical Jesus was in incorporating women into his ministry. *"The association of women with the ministry of Jesus is most unusual in the light of the attitude of first-century Palestinian Judaism toward women. The more common attitude is expressed in Jn 4:27, [the disciples were amazed that Jesus was talking to a woman] and early rabbinic documents caution against speaking with women in public."*

Today we take for granted the role women have in the continuing ministry of the Christ. I think of our own parish and the number of women who have leadership roles and provide tremendous support to our parish ministries. At the risk of missing someone (even Luke knew such a risk as he stated the inclusive yet anonymous *"and many others"* phrase in his Gospel) here is a quick list of some of the women in leadership roles at St. James:

Today's Gospel offers a reminder that Jesus rebelled against the norms, traditions, and religious practices of his time by including women into his ministry. Simon, the Pharisee, a guardian of the purity of Judaic law, could not understand this and neither could the disciples, the first bishops, who were "amazed" that Jesus would even talk to a woman.

Why are the first three verses of Chapter 8 included in today's Gospel? Because these women show all of us that forgiveness of sins [a.k.a. expulsion of demons] results in a loving response to follow Jesus completely. Thank God for such women and the example they give to all, lay and ordained, of what it means to follow Jesus and minister in our Church.

Field of Dreams Community Garden

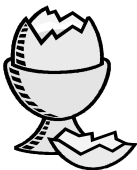

Engaged Encounter Weekend Coming to our Parish in Late Summer!!

We will be hosting an Engaged Encounter weekend at St. James for couples preparing for marriage. Since this is a "PILOT WEEKEND", the cost will be ONLY \$50 per couple. It will be held on August 6-8, 2010 utilizing our parish facility. Catholic Engaged Encounter is a marriage preparation program for couples being married in the Catholic Church. This weekend-long workshop will encourage couples to share honest and intensive communication about their future lives together, discussing nearly every aspect of their relationship, including money, children, sexuality, and their roles in the church and society. For many, even couples who have been together for many years, it is a unique opportunity for completely open and honest communication. The weekend often serves as a new foundation for a more enriching life together. So, why are we doing this?

In our early years of marriage, we could've used a formal preparation rooted in Christ. It was not until we attended Marriage Encounter that we were able to communicate better. Engaged Encounter weekends are modeled after this format. We have worked in marriage preparation ministry for most of our married life. We feel that engaged couples need time to reflect on their relationship prior to marriage. We were surprised that when moving back to this area, there was not any week-end marriage preparation similar to this program format. We have two needs:

One is to get couples about to be married in fall 2010 or in 2011 to sign up for this weekend. It is a great gift for parents or grandparents to give as a wedding gift. This will be a commuter weekend where the couples drive to/from the parish.

The second need is for support both for the week-end here at St. James and to bring National Engaged Encounter into Southeastern Wisconsin. We need your help in many ways.
