



From The Servant's Quarters

- Why do we celebrate the Birth of John the Baptist? In our Catholic tradition we usually focus on the day a member of the faith community was born into eternal life the day they died. We also do that for John the Baptist but include in the calendar a separate day to celebrate his being born into this world.
- This celebration dates back to the 4th century. There may have been some confusion as to how to understand

John the Baptist. have revealed the tial communities nes, living in degroup of religious and longing for the



to restore justice to the people of Israel.

- In his earlier years, Jesus may have even been connected with such communities. That may help to explain why Jesus presented himself for baptism in the Jordan by John.
- This may have caused even more confusion. The one baptizing was considered superior to those he was washing with the water of repentance and new birth. You may recall John's protest, to Jesus, "I should be baptized by YOU!"
- When John was in prison, his followers were lost. Whom do we follow? That's why John sent them to Jesus with the question, "Are you the one who is to to come or are we to look for another?" Jesus instructs them to relay to John, "Tell them what you have seen, the blind receive their sight, the lame walking, and the poor have the good news preached to them." These were the classical behaviors associated with the Messiah. The gospels attempt to clarify things when John says, "He must increase. I must decrease."
- It probably took a while for this message to spread. There is evidence that the desert communities loyal to John the Baptist continued to exist for the first few hundred years after Jesus.
- So with the pivotal role John plays between the longings and expectations of the people and the fulfillment of them in Jesus of Nazareth, it is not surprising that we not only remember his death (August 29th) but also his birth.
- Last weekend in my homily I referred to the need many have in our world for the healing of the "father wound." Franciscan priest, Fr. Richard Rohr has done considerable writing on this topic. One site you can check out is www.malespirituality.org Another site is www.cacradicalgrace.org
- A local Capuchin-Franciscan, Fr. Marty Pable has also

done writing and speaking on male spirituality. A few years ago Fr. Marty spoke in our Historic Chapel. You can view that video at www.vimeo.com/2037109

- You can also Google Fr. Marty Pable's name and discover various books he has written. I'd be interested to know if you find these resources helpful.
- We are very grateful for the work of John Swanson and Ray Gross in refurbishing the outdoor benches for the church. They now have a new lease on life! "Come and set a spell!"
- The trouble with being punctual is that nobody is there to appreciate it!
