### THANKSGIVING MASS

"Thank God!" How many times have you uttered that expression? "Thank God I wasn't driving on the highway at that time." (When a fatal accident occurred) "Thank God it's not cancer!" "Thank God my children are safe!" "Thank God no one was injured." "Thank God, it could have been worse!" "Thank God I still have my health." And so forth.

Thursday is national "Thank God" Day. Before the parade ends, before the first kick-off is broadcast, before the Turkey even goes into the oven, why not gather the family in church to say, "Thank God!" as we celebrate our Thanksgiving Day Mass at 9:00 a.m.

The collection at this Liturgy will be given to our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society to assist them in their work with those in need. Your generosity is greatly appreciated by the poor. Thank you.

#### **ADVENT SILENCE**

Next weekend begins the season of Advent. One of the hallmarks of Advent is "anticipation" – anticipating the coming of the Lord.

Have you ever awaited the arrival of a loved one at an airport or train station? Perhaps you have simply watched out the window of your home, expecting every set of headlights coming down the road to be those that would deliver a loved one safely to you. Or maybe you attentively waited, wide eyed, attuned, and sleepless for the sound of a teenager to come safely home in the middle of the night. This is Advent. As we wait a silence seems to envelop us, to surround us in a type of bubble which blocks out all other thoughts and distractions. The silence keeps us focused on our waiting and quickens our pulse. The anticipation and expectation grows.

In silence we wait. The shrill noise of a train whistle, the screeching brakes on a jet, the honking of a horn cut through the silence and jolt us into a heart-pounding expectation that our wait is over.

Silence.

Stillness.

Maybe there is less anticipation of the coming of the Messiah in our world because there is so little silence. We are surrounded with constant noise, the ringing of bells, and repetitive instrumental Carrols.

Here at St. James we build silence into our liturgies. There is silence after our first and second readings as well as the psalm response. This Advent there will be a deliberately planned silence after each homily in order to give us the opportunity to sit in stillness, to reflect, and to experience the type of waiting for the Messiah that this season of Advent commemorates.

Silence. ~ Stillness. ~ Waiting. These are the gifts of Advent in a season filled with noise and impatient shuffling through malls.

Savor the silence of Advent.
