


Be the Light by taking a **Leap of Faith** Corporal and Spiritual Work of Mercy card from a basket on the altar.

Messages from our PA



- This weekend's Scripture readings are so full of meaningful insights, it was challenging to choose one to focus upon. However, my spiritual reading for Lent, Fr. Robert Spitzer's The Light Shines on in the Darkness: Transforming Suffering through Faith, makes specific reference to the verse from today's Exodus reading: "*For I, the Lord, your God, am a jealous God, inflicting punishment for their fathers' wickedness on the children of those who hate me, down to the third and fourth generation; ...*" Fr. Spitzer maintains that this reference is an expression of the human construct of God, attributing to God the same sense of justice or "pay-back" that we human beings are familiar with. He also maintains that Jesus, in fulfilling the Law without abolishing it, turns that construct topsy-turvy with his identification of the Father not as a "pay-back God" but rather as "Abba"—"Daddy"—and as the unimaginably merciful father figure in the Prodigal Son parable. We can see an inherent sense of this merciful God even in the Old Testament representations, and specifically in this same reading from Exodus, which continues with the oft-left-out: "*but bestowing mercy down to the thousandth generation on the children of those who love me and keep my commandments.*"

So the commandments that God is enjoining the Israelites with in this reading are not intended to be a restrictive, oppressive, forbidding code, but rather a guide to right relationships with God and others that leads to a connective, freeing, and empowering way of life. This understanding is well expressed by the psalmist who uses the following descriptors of the "law of the Lord" in today's responsorial Psalm 19: *perfect, refreshing, trustworthy, right, rejoicing, clear, enlightening, pure, enduring, true, just, precious, sweet...*

Have you ever tried to ignore an itch? Maybe there was a time when your extended family had gathered for a group picture and everyone was trying to hold still until the baby stopped squirming so that you would get a good shot. And just then you got a tickle on your nose. If you scratched it you could ruin the picture for everyone but you just need to scratch it. The more you ignore it, the worse it gets. If you've ever been in a situation like that, you know what we mean. The itch is almost irresistible. You have to do something.

Spring is a bit like an itch that begs to be scratched. The weather teases us by warming up a bit. A few geese start flying north. The sun lingers longer in the sky and we start looking for signs of those spring plants poking hopefully through the soil. That's the spring itch.

We don't want you to ignore that itch and we have the perfect way to scratch it. Contact Paul (information below) about being a volunteer seed starter. We provide all the supplies, you provide some sunlight, warmth and water so that our plants will be ready for our plant sale and gardens. We're hoping to start nearly 1,500 plants this year. Some of our seeds have started already, but in order to be ready for the **plant sale on the weekend of May 20th** we need to be starting peppers by March 25 and tomatoes by April 1st. Don't delay, volunteer to raise some plants. We'd love to help you scratch your spring itch.
