Seven Pain Symptoms You Should Never Ignore

If you're hurting, see a doctor. It's sound advice, and may seem obvious, but older adults sometimes write off pain as a function of aging and may wait too long to get medical attention. A doctor should check out any new or unexplained pain, even if it's not severe.

There are some types of pain that are more likely to signal something serious, so head straight to the ER if you experience any one of these:



- Pain with loss of function, which can indicate a fracture, nerve injury, loss of blood flow or a serious infection.
- Eye pain that comes out of nowhere, which could be related to a blocked blood vessel, internal bleeding or acute glaucoma, or the first symptom of shingles.
- Chest pain, especially if triggered by exertion, any chest pain should be evaluated by a doctor immediately. A heart attack doesn't always manifest as sudden, crushing pain, but can be dull pressure or heaviness. Other symptoms of a heart attack include dizziness, fatigue or shortness of breath while doing ordinary activities.
- The worst headache of your life, while an occasional headache is usually nothing to worry about, one that feels more severe than usual is concerning.
- Severe abdominal pain, if accompanied by vomiting, swelling, or a fever can indicate appendicitis, a serious infection, or diverticulitis.
- Calf pain, especially after surgery. Increasing pain in your calf after a long period of inactivity can be a sign of deep vein thrombosis, which can lead to a life-threatening condition called pulmonary embolism.
- Pain from a minor wound, which gets worse over a few days, could be indicative of infection and should be looked at immediately.
