A Note from Brigitte Glinski, Parish Nurse

The Many Benefits of Mindfulness, Prayer, and Meditation

Mindfulness, meditation, or prayer when practiced
30 minutes every day over eight weeks, has shown a
difference in several brain regions that control learning,
emotions, memory, and the fear response. These regions
include the amygdala and the hippocampus, regions that
control the fight/flight/freeze/fawn response.

In regulating these regions of the brain survivors of
childhood trauma and anyone who was exposed to a
traumatic event learn to control their reactions to events that
trigger flashbacks.

According to the American Psychological Organization,
there are many benefits to practicing mindfulness, prayer,
and meditation, including all of the following:

- Better sleep
- Calmer emotions
- Increased ability to focus
- Increased memory
- Greater self-awareness
- Increased resiliency
- Enhanced ability to safely experience feelings
- Reduced stress levels



A study conducted on medical students studying to become
physicians found that participating in an eight-week
meditation-based stress reduction intervention had lowered
self-reported anxiety and a reduced amount of depression.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING COMMITTEE UPDATE

January is Human Trafficking Awareness Month!

I hope you'll take time out to pray the prayer
I have included below.



Trafficking occurs in every one of our
72 counties in Wisconsin. Sometimes hard to
believe, but I think the article borrowed from
from MKE Lifestyle explains a bit of what is going on in our
State.

TAKEN IN PLAIN SITE Over the years, Wisconsin has
become a prime corridor for the ongoing human trafficking crisis.
Each of Wisconsin's 72 counties have reported human trafficking
cases and, in 2019, *the state was ranked sixth in the nation* by
the Human Trafficking Institute. Injury and Violence Prevention
Director of the City of Milwaukee Health Department Office of
Violence Prevention Reggie Moore says the popular large
festivals in the area, as well as nationally known travel
destinations like Wisconsin Dells and Lake Geneva, might factor
into the growing epidemic. "Resort towns, ports, and large-scale
events can be hot spots for the commercial sex trade and human
trafficking," he explains. "Given our proximity to Chicago and
Minneapolis, Wisconsin is conveniently located between two
large cities. The demand in rural communities is also a concern,
where trafficking of all types goes underreported." MKE Lifestyle
